What Does It Mean To Be Board-Certified?

You may be asking what exactly it means to be board-certified. Below are the basic requirements a family physician must successfully complete to be certified by the ABFM.

- Complete Medical School to obtain an MD or DO degree
- Complete 3 more years of training in family medicine
- Keep a state license to practice medicine (requires good standing and more education)
- Passing written exams every 10 years to test knowledge
- Continue to learn the latest in medicine
- Partner with patients to improve health

Focus On Your Family

Knowing your family doctor is ABFM-certified tells you your doctor is qualified and continues to sharpen his or her skills, while staying on top of changes in medical knowledge.

When you choose a board-certified doctor, you can be sure he or she meets standards for education, knowledge, experience, and skills to provide high quality care.

To keep board certification, a family physician must keep up with the latest in medicine and ethics.

Ask Your Doctor

Don't be shy! Ask your doctor if he or she is up-to-date with ABFM certification. Ask if your family physician has enrolled in Family Medicine Certification.
