



The American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) has a long history of collecting data from ABFM Diplomates to evaluate whether its certification program is meeting their needs in different practice environments. As residency training is the standard entry into certification, and in response to the growth in residency training and new flexibility in curricula design with new Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) program requirements, ABFM decided to begin surveying residents in training in 2023.

The National Resident Survey (NRS) provides an opportunity for residents to include their voice and input on residency training, changes in scope of practice, desired career options, and satisfaction/wellness. Data from the NRS will support ABFM's educational innovation, research, and policy work to promote a well-trained workforce that can meet the health needs of their communities.

The NRS was administered to all family medicine residents who completed the ABFM In-Training Examination (ITE) in October 2023. Of the 14,692 residents offered the NRS, 9,369 (63.8%) responded to at least one item on the survey and 5,759 (39.3%) completed the entire survey.

Each class of residents were given different questions. Each item in this report is labeled with which class of residents answered the question. The number of residents answering each question is also included.

For the two items on burnout, responses of "once a week" or more frequently indicate symptoms of either emotional exhaustion or callousness.
